Back to School Festival

Engaged over 325 Baltimore youth by distributing essential school supplies for the 2024–2025 academic year. The event also featured interactive arts, educational enrichment, and sports activities, while offering refreshments and on-site voter registration to empower families and promote civic participation

Educational Services

In partnership w/ the Maryland Educational Opportunity Center

200 individuals served (some w/multiple services below)

- 130 received Academic Advisement
- 100 received Financial Aid Counseling/FAFSA Assistance
- 70 received Admissions Assistance/Training Referrals
- 75 received Academic/Training Information
- 6 received GED Counseling/Referrals
- 25 received Career Counseling

Post-secondary Results:

- (113) Post-secondary placements
- (5) Enrolled into 4-year colleges
- (65) Enrolled into 2-year colleges
- (43) Enrolled into Training Programs

Secondary Results:

- (45) Enrolled into GED Programs
- (10) Received a GED

Financial Literacy/Financial Aid:

Conducted Financial Literacy Workshop for the Baltimore City Housing Authority at Douglas Homes and Financial Aid Workshops at Western High School and the New Kingdom Faith Christian Center Summer Program for the second consecutive year.





Thanksgiving Baskets

In partnership with First Tabernacle Beth El Provided 1200 servings of food to deserving families as identified by the Dept. of Social Services and other community partners.

National Academy Foundation

Supported our neighboring high/middle school with achievement incentives, postsecondary preparation, school supplies, and other outreach services including a \$600 gift.

Care A Lot Program

Employed two underserved community members to clean and maintain 25 city lots as part of a neighborhood revitalization effort, providing a total stipend of \$8,321.

Jerilynn Reid Learning Center

Established and/or maintained partnerships with the following organizations:

- **Restorative Rescue Inc.** – Provides Allied Health Education courses including Medical Assistant, Medication Technician, Phlebotomy, CPR, and First Aid certification.
- **Royal Driving Academy** – Supports the mobility of low-wage workers by offering accessible driver education and training.
- **Another Chance Youth and Families Mentoring Program Inc.** – Offers mentorship for youth and a range of supportive services for families and individuals.

4 H Club

In partnership with U of Md Extension

23 youth registered and were exposed to various STEAM related curricula. This year our club had multiple first place winners in photography at the Baltimore City Expo and at the Maryland State Fair.



Community Garden

Employed a local resident as the community garden caretaker to oversee planting and upkeep, ensuring fresh produce was accessible to neighborhood residents. In collaboration with United Way and the Baltimore Ravens, hosted a 'CAW to Action' event focused on garden-centered neighborhood beautification and cleanup efforts. Additionally, provided a \$500 stipend to support garden helpers who contributed to the initiative's success.

(ACDC is the only nonprofit in East Baltimore to maintain a community garden and a 4H Club)

- Board of Directors Contributions - (\$10702)
- Individual Donors - (\$2198)
- Gifts of In-Kind Goods - (\$3003)
- Baltimore Civic Fund Care-a-Lot Grant – (\$8321) for vacant lot maintenance.
- Municipal Employees Credit Union – (\$2500) to support our 4H program and “Back to School” efforts.
- Willis Foundation – (\$1500) to support ADA Compliance for our commercial kitchen.
- Firstline Strategies Unlimited Inc. – (\$500) to support our “Back to School” efforts.
- Corporate Sponsorships – Received (\$2685) from Travelers Insurance, (\$2040) from Northrup Grumman, and (\$100 from) Transunion to support our Outreach efforts, the Jerrilyn Reid Learning Center, and general operations.
